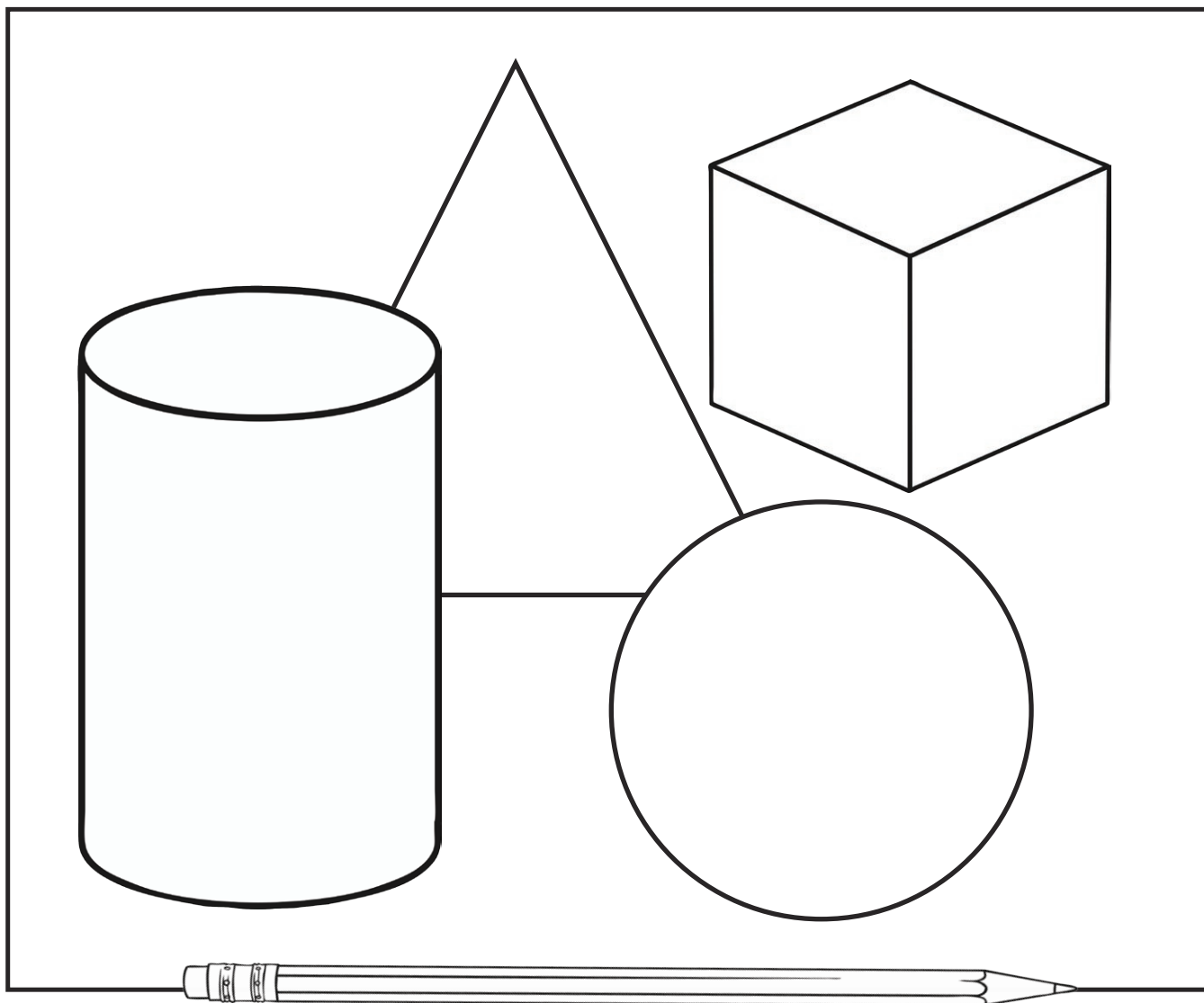
Your task today is to develop your tonal shading skills using the techniques of cross-hatching, blending, stippling, contour-hatching and scumbling.
